As news regarding the Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) surges and new cases increase daily across the state and country, we wanted to reiterate what University of Cleveland Preparatory School is currently doing to help prevent the spread of this virus — and illness in general in efforts to keep students and staff safe.

In an abundance of caution and to help slow the spread of the virus, all school-related and district-sponsored evening events are canceled through April 3rd. This is effective immediately and includes sports, tutoring, competitions, club meetings, and any other non-essential events that include outside spectators.

Additionally, effective Monday, March 16, 2020 all schools across the state of Ohio will be closed for three weeks or until further notice. Closing schools statewide is a precaution being initiated under the guidance of Governor DeWine. This will be an extended Spring Break for our scholars.

As we have transitioned into a statewide school closing, University of Cleveland Preparatory School is dedicated to providing continued instructional practice for all scholars. 
The work provided will allow scholars to remain on track with their learning and progress towards proficiency on their Ohio State Assessments (OST) that will be administered upon return to school.
