STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS



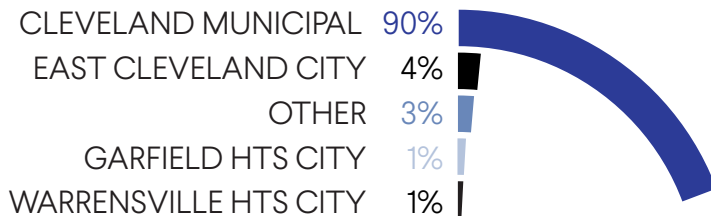

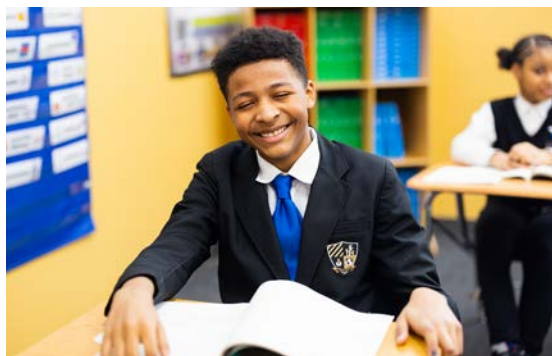
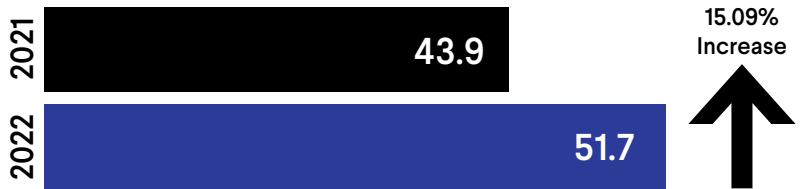

ACADEMIC PROGRESS

University of Cleveland Preparatory School is undergoing remarkable academic recovery since the pandemic. The school increased its Performance Index (PI) score by 15%. 100% of third graders met the reading requirements for promotion to Grade 4. UCP additionally exceeded state expectations for student academic growth (4 Stars, Progress) and for closing educational gaps (4 Stars, Gap Closing). 56% of fifth and eighth graders achieved annual typical growth in English Language Arts as measured by i-Ready. 61% of seventh graders and 75% of eighth graders also achieved annual typical growth in Math.

YOY GROWTH IN PERFORMANCE INDEX SCORE



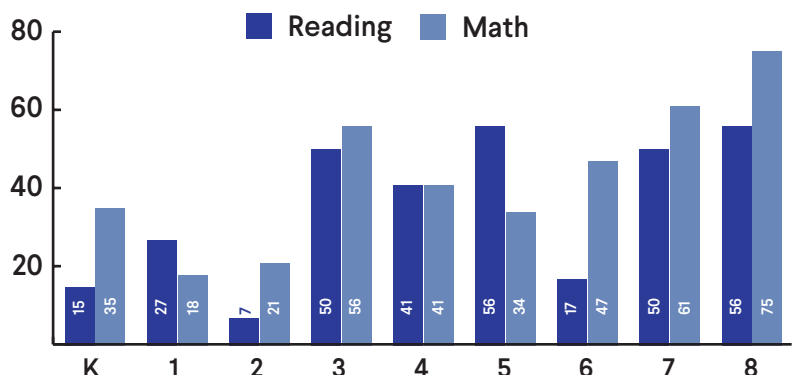
