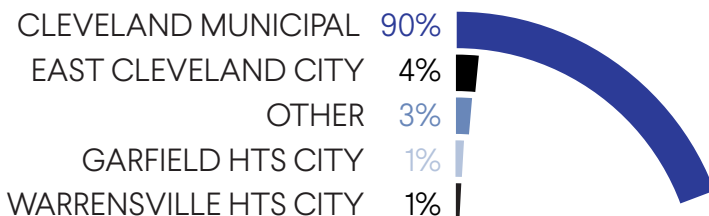

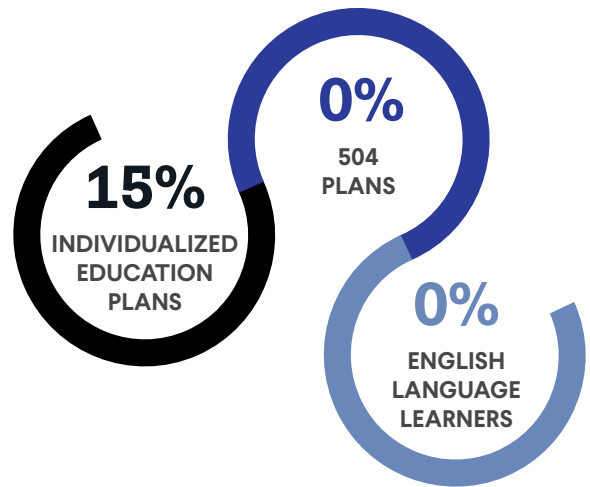

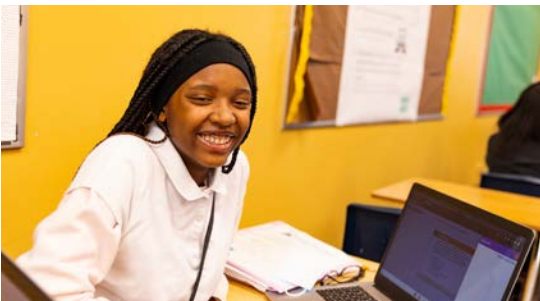

## HIGHLIGHTS

- 100% of students met the state requirements for promotion to Grade 4
- Provided 1141 instructional hours, 24% more than the Ohio requirement for charter schools
- Received an ACCEL Schools award for Outstanding Teacher Retention

- Promoted positive school culture through Student of the Month and Teacher of the Month recognition programs

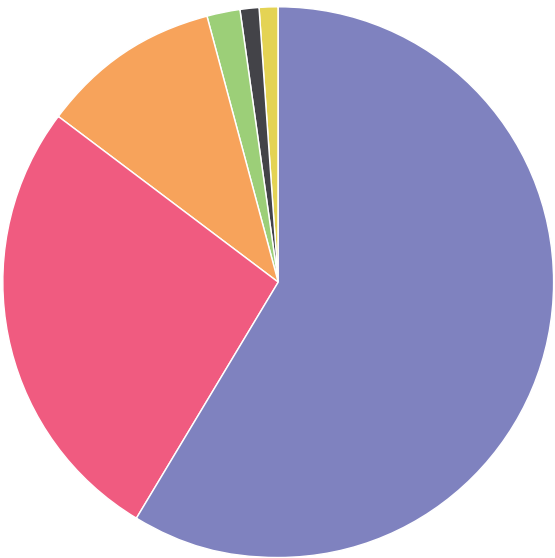

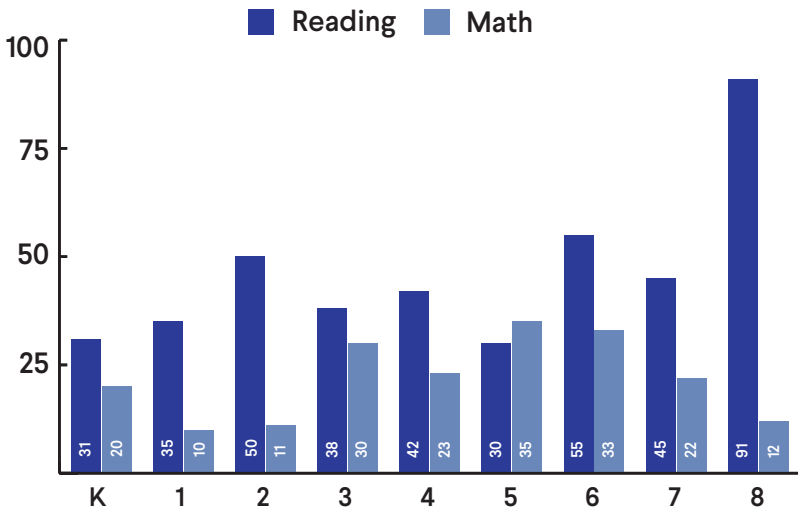
